Schopwick Surgery - Background

Schopwick Surgery was originally founded in Elstree in 1931 by Dr Winn Everett. The practice has been operating from premises at Romeland, Elstree WD6 3BJ since 1984 and additionally, from premises at Windmill Street, Bushey since 1994. The GPs and Practice team provide primary care services to a combined patient population which currently stands at 13,000 and is increasing rapidly.

The Proposal

The map shows the location of each of our surgeries. The proposal is to <u>retain</u> the Bushey Surgery and <u>relocate</u> from our Elstree premises to a new, larger building to accommodate our increasing number of Elstree and Borehamwood patients and provide additional services to the whole patient population.



Why do we need to relocate?

The Elstree Surgery was built in 1984 and has served the practice well over the years. However, it is no longer suitable for providing the services and standard of care we would like to offer our patient community

Key issues and constraints are:-

The building is too small and does not have enough rooms for the clinical services

The building no longer meets current standards for primary care premises.

Expanded services – we would like to provide a larger Treatment room

We are a long-established teaching and training practice and are keen to expand this to include training for community nurses and paramedics but are constrained by the lack of space.

Shortage of parking facilities is a <u>big issue</u> - with only 9 spaces, we desperately need more parking spaces for both our staff and patients



The solution

The Partners of the Schopwick Surgery have been considering alternative premises options for our Elstree Surgery for a number of years. Expansion on the existing site is unfeasible as such we have been working with our specialist partners for some time to progress sourcing available sites that satisfy our requirements and progress discussions with the parties who will facilitate the development.

We would like to propose the relocation of the Elstree Building to a larger purpose built surgery.

This proposal is subject to CCG and NHS England approvals of a business case. This patient survey and feedback forms an essential part of the business case document . Plus of course the project will be subject to the Local authority planning process


Site location


The proposed site is off Allum Lane, o.6 miles from the existing Elstree Surgery and therefore also closer for our Borehamwood patients.

The proposed Surgery is on several Bus Routes (Nos. 107, 306 & 823) – the Knowl Way stop is immediately adjacent to the site.



Proximity to the existing Elstree Surgery






New building floor plans







Benefits of the new building

This development proposal is for a high quality, modern purpose built Primary Care Centre with significantly more car-parking spaces. The building has been designed for us by Haven Health's specialist award-winning architect, Antony Kavanagh of Leo Architects. It will provide an attractive, calm clinical environment which will benefit the health and well-being of both patients and staff

The new building will provide:

- Spacious waiting areas
- More clinical rooms
- On site pharmacy
- More space to allow for training of GP's, nurses and other healthcare staff in a training 'hub'
- Large health promotion room for a wider variety of groups to use
- Facilities for staff welfare

Benefits for patients - more services

The new building would provide much needed space and first-class facilities to enable the practice to deliver a wider and increased range of services.

Our GP's and clinical staff chave a wide range of special interests Including:
